Terra Nova Testing

The week of April 29th-May 2nd is an important week at Teays Valley Christian School. During this time, all of our students, grades kindergarten through eleventh, will be taking the Terra Nova Achievement Test. *It is extremely important that all of our students be present during these days*. The tests are not designed to be administered at a later date to students who are absent during all or part of the testing. Make-up sessions are difficult to administer.

It is also important that each student be prepared mentally, physically, and emotionally for this battery of tests. I am including some testing tips for parents to assist you in preparing your child for his/her best performance. Some tips are; get plenty of rest, eat a good breakfast, plan ahead to avoid stressful mornings, encourage your child to do his or her best even though the test may be hard, and maintain a normal routine. TVCS has to report our scores to the WV Department of Education each year and we utilize this data to evaluate and make changes in our curriculum and programs.

Second Grade Studying the Life of Jesus

Second Grade just completed our book study, Growing Up Where Jesus Lived. As we journeyed through ancient Israel, we read about what Jesus may have done and experienced as well as what it was like to be a child at this time. The ten-chapter book included a story about Joshua and first Passover visit Jerusalem. The book has given the class a first-hand sense of the time and culture of Israel as the also practiced students comprehension skills. We participated in a cumulative, hands-on experience with the



children dressing in simple costumes and tasting foods from the book and eating them together in the manner and customs described in our reading.

Living Wax Museum

Our 2nd Wax Museum was held on Thursday, March 14, in the gym. There were 72 participants from grades 3-6, dressed in period costumes representing famous people they have studied about in history class. Students researched a person of their choosing, made an informative backdrop to go along with their report, and dressed in costume. A technology component was added to the project by using a QR code connected to a student's first-person account of their life. The Music and Art departments helped create an authentic "museum" feel by serving refreshments. We were happy to share our Wax Museum with the community by inviting Fox Channel 11 to cover our exhibitors.

Animal Research and Habitat Dioramas

Kindergarten, 1st, and 2nd grades presented their animal habitat dioramas in the commons on Wednesday, April 17.

Kindergarten made shoe box dioramas for their favorite animal. The class wrote one to two sentences about the animal's appearance and their food.

First grade researched different animals. They learned what they looked like, what they ate, and where they lived. Then the children made dioramas of their assigned animal and their habitat.

Second grade is learning about researching and writing a research paper this year. The students worked in groups to research their animals using a variety of sources. They completed their research writing process independently with teacher assistance. Then the students created dioramas about their animal and its habitat.

Campus Wear Amendment

For the upcoming 2019-2020 school year, we will be making an addition to the Campus Wear policies by allowing pants to be purchased through other vendors. Pants must continue to be either khaki or navy in color with **no jean, stretchy/legging, cargo, or tight-fitting materials allowed**. You can still order pants through School Closet as this is just an additional option for pants purchasing. All other campus wear items must continue to be purchased through School Closet.

Tuition and SMART529 Plans

Recent changes to federal tax law allow for SMART529 accounts to be used to pay tuition and expenses for children enrolled in K-12 private and religious schools.

- Families with children enrolled in grades K 12 at private and religious schools are eligible to use SMART529 accounts to pay for school expenses up to \$10,000 annually.
- K 12 SMART529 distributions can be made from existing or newly opened accounts.
- Qualified K 12 SMART529 distributions are tax exempt at the federal level.
- Contributions made by Dec. 31st each year can be used to reduce your federal adjusted gross income for West Virginia personal income tax purposes.
- Requesting a SMART529 K 12 disbursement is easy go to the web site listed below to get started!

Why Sports?

Athletics play a valuable role in the development and character of students. The goals of our athletic department must be guided by our personal and educational philosophy. Some of those goals are to be Christ-centered and reflect a Christian worldview; to be committed to the total development (spiritual, academic, social, physical, and emotional growth) of the student-athlete; to strive for excellence in the entire athletic program including areas such as leadership, behavior, facilities, and financial support; and to provide an opportunity for the loyalty of the student-body, parents, patrons and friends of the school, and the community to be constantly renewed, strengthened, and united.

Athletics is a microcosm of life, reflecting real life situations such as handling conflict, consequences of a work ethic, making sound decisions under pressure, dealing with success and failure, coping with disappointment, submission to coaches and officials, importance of teamwork, and the opportunity to excel for individuals with various learning styles and intellectual abilities. Athletics also provide opportunities for students to build relationships not only with teammates but also with opponents that go beyond the playing field. It teaches them to be dedicated and committed, and the importance of balance in their lives to something bigger than themselves.

On the Track

The middle and high school track season is in full swing, competing against some of the best athletes in the state. Nearly all of our athletes have broken their own personal records while Macey Smith broke the Teays Valley Christian Girls Middle School record for discus. With only 16 athletes between high school and middle school, our teams have been able to score points in the 1600M run and discus throw as well as coming extremely close to placing in long jump and the 100M, 200M and 400M dashes as well. We are extremely proud of all our track athletes and look forward to an exciting end to our season at WVCAT on April 23, 2019.



Around the Diamond (Baseball)

Our baseball team this season has found themselves in a unique situation...athletes from 3 different schools, competing on one team, working together, and having FUN! TVCS has partnered with Calvary Baptist Academy for the past few years allowing their students to compete on our baseball team, but this year another local school, Cross Lanes Christian, was not going to be able to field a team so TVCS extended the invitation to CLCS as well. The result...3 schools, 26 athletes (5 CL, 5 CBA, 16 TVCS), a Varsity/JV Team, and a lot of baseball! This team has also put together some strong wins this season against Grace Christian, Wood County Christian, Greater Beckley Christian, Rosehill Christian, and Buffalo High School (1st time in school history). Their season wraps up at the end of the month and hopefully with a WVCAT Championship.
